The only sensible right of way is through Placentia. Why end it at the freeway? I would suggest carring it over to at least Old Elsinore Rd or better yet, west of there. An access from Old Elsinore would enhance traffic for locals (such as myself) who now have to drive north to Cajalco then east to the freeway of Harvill & backtrack that distance again to go either to Perris blvd or downtown Perris.

I noticed online a map dated 1959 that showed Ethanac Rd going through from the present Rt 74 east finally connecting to where the 215 is now. This route also would be a great help for all traffic, not just loacals and would eliminate the "dogleg" of Rt 74 from downtown Perris south to where it exits to continue east. If it made sense in 1959 it surely makes even more sense now. Most if not all of the new portion is raw land so the investment would be very minimal resulting in the cost being for the construction itself.
